Empowering Women and Youth for Climate Action in Bangladesh

Why are women and youth crucial to climate action in Bangladesh?

Bangladesh, one of the most climate-vulnerable countries, faces threats such as rising sea levels, cyclones, and erratic weather, with women and youth disproportionately impacted. Women, especially in rural areas, struggle with limited access to education, financial services, and decision-making roles, while youth are often excluded from key climate decisions. Despite being at the forefront of climate change, their involvement in adaptation and mitigation is often overlooked.

Studies show that empowering women and youth leads to more effective and sustainable outcomes, yet gender inequality and systemic exclusion remain major barriers, limiting the impact of climate action.

What is Green Voices all about?


Green Voices, funded by the Embassy of the Kingdom of The Netherlands and managed by The Asia Foundation, empowers women, youth, and marginalized communities in Bangladesh's climate-vulnerable areas.

In collaboration with Bonhishikha and The Earth, the project integrates these groups into climate adaptation and mitigation strategies through policy advocacy, capacity building, and green innovation.

Over the course of two years, it aims to create an inclusive and resilient climate action strategy, empowering these communities to become key drivers of change in Bangladesh's fight against climate change.


